The Head of Music and Chorus Master is responsible for the implementation of the company's vision in matters relating to music, musical resources (whether financial, instrumental, or staffing related), technical performance requirements, and chorus and orchestral performance requirements. The role works closely with the Artistic Director, visiting conductors and directors, artists and musicians; and also acts as the primary Chorus Master for all State Opera productions.

This position represents a compelling opportunity for a seasoned music professional, with extensive experience within the operatic artform, who is seeking flexible part-time work in a dynamic environment.

**Nature of role:** This is a part-time role, equivalent to 3 days per week. A high degree of flexibility is needed as the hours and demands required of this role are seasonal and vary greatly week to week, as per the nature of the performing arts industry. The role will often be required to work outside of business hours and on weekends; with appropriate management of hours and Time Off in Lieu to offset.

**Remuneration:** \$85,000 per annum FTE / pro rata salary of \$51,000 per annum, plus 9.5% superannuation.
